This Sunday (the fifth Sunday in Lent) is sometimes known as Passion Sunday. Traditionally it is a time to think about what Jesus suffered and why. It is a tough Sunday and the gospel reading has Jesus predicting that he will be "lifted up" – meaning that he will be killed by being put on a cross. Fiona who chooses our activities each week said that this week she just couldn't find material that seemed suitable – even though she tried. So, how might we respond?

One way might be for the grown ups in the household to think about how can we talk about the story of Jesus' death. If we try, it will perhaps show our young people that our faith is not just about happy times – actually its strength comes from knowing it can help us in the rough times too. Not easy – but worth the try?
