"Dippy was the first Diplodocus (DIP-low-DOCK-us) to go on display anywhere in the world when it was gifted to London's Natural History Museum in 1905. Dippy quickly became a star, capturing hearts and imaginations, until 2017, when he began his travels. Through a tour around the UK, which involved travelling through different environments in all seasons, Dippy inspired millions of people to reconsider their relationship with nature. At a time when the UK's biodiversity is in decline, Dippy witnessed the changing state of the nation's wildlife and reminded us of the joy of our local landscape and our need to protect it."
