It used to be a Mothering Sunday tradition in medieval times but is now only practised in a few churches around the UK. What do you think of introducing it at St Columba's – surrounding your "mother" church and giving it a big hug?

Of course, most people think of this Sunday as Mother's Day, more than Mothering Sunday. I'm sure there will be hugs for, and from, mothers where possible. Whether you are planning a treat or a celebration for a mother or not, you might take time to make this prayer:

we thank you for all mothers and carers around the world,
